

Breastfeeding Courses Recognized by LEAARC

These courses offer 40-89 hours and prepare students to educate families and provide anticipatory guidance, assistance, and support in the normal course of breastfeeding. LEAARC also provides Approval for comprehensive lactation management courses with 90 or more contact hours. In addition, LEAARC serves in cooperation with the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs (CAAHEP) for official recognition of academic lactation programs which meet IBLCE Pathway 2 criteria.

This course provides graduate students with the opportunity to learn and apply approaches used by public health professionals to promote breastfeeding in the community. Emphasis is on analyzing breastfeeding behavior using a social-ecological model of thinking. Topics include epidemiological trends in breastfeeding, health outcomes associated with breastfeeding, public health initiatives and policies that influence breastfeeding, social norms and cultural factors influencing breastfeeding, and key breastfeeding concepts. Skill development in breastfeeding promotion includes the lactation educator's scope of practice, counseling skills, application of theory to understand factors influencing breastfeeding behavior, and selection of strategies to influence breastfeeding behavior.

The North Carolina Educator Training Program is a collaboration between Forsyth Medical Center, the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services (WIC) and Northwest Area Health Education Center. This is a seven-day course that targets healthcare professionals who work with breastfeeding mothers and offers the necessary knowledge and skills for providing basic breastfeeding management and support. These skills focus on basic prenatal and postpartum counseling and the management of common concerns and clinical problems. The interactive training involves five days of didactic sessions, two days of clinical rotations and an independent study assignment.

This training prepares health professionals and other interested individuals to become lactation educators. It furnishes the basic information necessary to promote breastfeeding and to interact in the breastfeeding situation by assisting and encouraging the breastfeeding triad of mother, baby, and support person. Topics include basic anatomy and physiology of lactation, early attachment of the baby, hospital care, support during the postpartum stage, common concerns and solutions, and appliances and apparatuses used in breastfeeding. Training is offered either in-person (5-day course) or Online (video lecture, quarter long course). This course can also be brought to a facility for personalized staff training. N720 Human Lactation is a popular, long-standing, graduate online course offered by the Wichita State University School of Nursing. The course is taught by Jolynn A. Dowling; MSN, ARNP-NNP, IBCLC. This course is designed for health professionals with a minimum of two years clinical experience working with breastfeeding dyads who plan to take the IBCLC exam within the year, and those needing a refresher course for recertification. It confers 60 CERPs and 4 graduate credit hours from an accredited university. Undergraduates are admitted to the program on a case-by-case basis. All classes are on-line and a scholarly paper/project is required. This course requires instructor approval and student clearance for enrollment.
